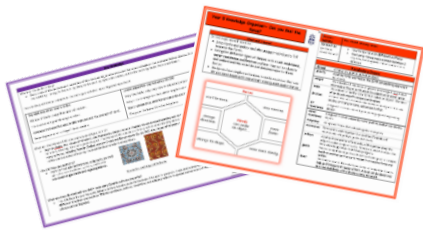
SATs can feel stressful for both children and parents. It helps to talk about them at home as well as at school. Children usually do better when they feel calm and relaxed.

Reading is very important, so please encourage your child to read at least 3 times a week. Talk together about the book, the characters, and the story. Ask your child what they think about it. This helps both their learning and their SATs preparation.

Study guides, questions books and practice paper packs for maths, reading and SPAG are available from the school office.

After SATs, we will start a fun science topic about keeping our hearts and bodies healthy. Our final topic is about Victorian railways. Children will also take part in a bridge-building challenge and learn how railways have changed from Victorian times to today.

For each topic, a Knowledge Organiser will be sent home. This will explain what children will learn, key words, and useful websites. There will also be home learning challenges for children to try.

In PSHE, the children will learn about healthy relationships. Later in the term, the children will have the option to partake in Y6 RSE (Sex Education programme) lessons. We will send out further information regarding this closer to the time.

After SATs, the summer term is always an exciting time for year 6 with many fun and engaging activities in the diary; these include days at the sports field, the Walesby residential, a trip to discover old railways at Woodthorpe Park and the Year 6 Leavers' Presentation.

In June, we are excited to see the return of our fantastic Walesby Residential which will run from Wednesday 10th June until Friday 12th June. There will be a parents' evening arranged after SATs to give you a chance to discuss anything relating to Walesby.

It is important your child comes to school every day so they can continue to make progress with their learning. Missing school does mean your child can fall behind and it can be difficult to catch up. If your child needs medicine during the day, please speak to the school office who can complete forms and help make the necessary arrangements.
