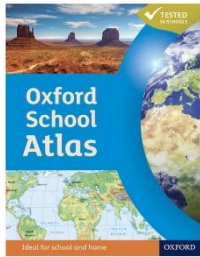


The Shard

a place where lots of people live



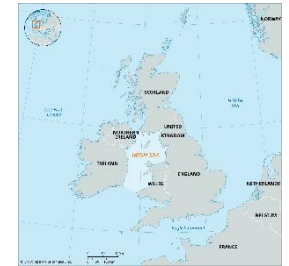
country
