Vocabulary Dozen

Branch	A woody part of a tree that grows out from the trunk.
Flower	The part of a plant that has petals
Garden	A place for growing flowers or vegetables. They are usually outside houses.
Leaves	The flat parts of a plant or tree that are usually green
Map	A drawing that helps you find a place
Direction	Using compass points to move around; North East South West
Petals	The separate leaves round the outside of a flower.
Roots	The part of a plant that grows underground.
Stem	The main part of a plant that grows up from the ground.
Tree	A woody plant that has a long trunk and branches.
Trunk	The main stem of a tree.
wild	Living or growing where they want to

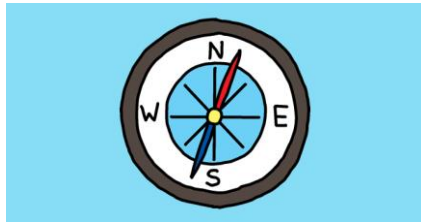


Key Knowledge - Maps
