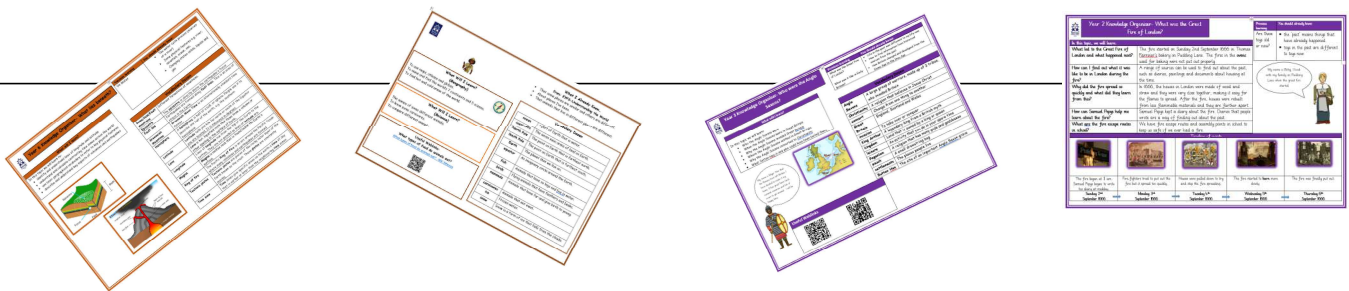


Home Learning Challenges

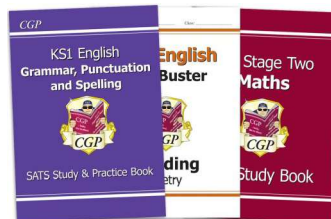
Knowledge Organisers
