



Year 5 Knowledge Organiser- Berridge then or now – which is best?

What will I learn?

In this topic we will learn:

- The key events in Berridge's history
- What previous pupils (across various decades) remember from their time at Berridge
- How the local area has changed through a study of OS maps
- What school food was like in the early days of school dinners
- What ingredients can be used to make a healthy school lunch

Key Knowledge

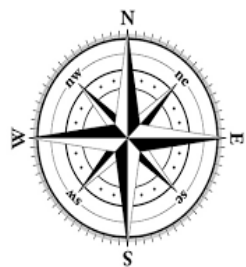
What are the key events in Berridge's history?	Pupils will study the history of Berridge School. The school was built in Victorian times and has continued to develop over the decades. They will learn that all pupils were on a single site; that boys and girls used to be taught separately; that during the war the school was used as a hospital and that it has an air-raid shelter under it.
What do old pupils remember about Berridge? (Interviews)	A number of ex-pupils from a range of dates will be invited into school and interviewed by the children to find out what was like at a particular point in history. This information will help them decide their answer to the question <i>Berridge then or now - which is best?</i>
How can perspective bring a picture to life?	Pupils will be taught about what perspective means in art and how it makes it possible to represent a 3D image in a 2D piece of art. They will identify examples of perspective, the horizon and the vanishing point and use these skills to produce their own piece of art.
How has the local area changed? (Field work, O.S. maps)	Pupils will use ordnance survey maps of the local area (Digimap) and be able to locate key features using ordnance survey symbols. They will also study an old map of the area to identify human and physical features in the locality and how they have changed. They will visit the local area to find out other changes since school was built which are not shown by maps.
What was school food like? Which ingredients would make a healthy quiche? What is the most popular quiche recipe?	Pupils will be taught to understand and apply the principles of a healthy and varied diet. After they have evaluated old-style school food options, they will design, prepare and cook a savoury dish (quiche) using a range of cooking techniques. They will use their understanding of seasonality, knowledge of how a variety of ingredients are grown, reared, caught and processed and costs to produce a more healthy and tasty alternative which is still affordable.

change	something alters or becomes different over time
continuity	something stays the same over time
fieldwork	Fieldwork is observing and collecting information (data) about people and places
grid reference	a map reference indicating a location in terms of a series of vertical and horizontal grid lines identified by numbers or letters. "on the Ordnance Survey map, grid reference SP 508069"
horizon	the line where the Earth and sky seem to meet
locality	an area or neighbourhood
OS map	OS maps are maps of Great Britain created by the Ordnance Survey (OS), the country's national mapping agency.
perspective	The art of representing 3D objects on a 2D surface
quiche	A baked flan with a savoury filling with eggs and cheese
savoury	A food which is salty or spicy rather than sweet
seasonality	The fact of varying with the seasons
vanishing point	a point in a perspective drawing where parallel lines appear to meet
