What we do?

The Uniform Project Nottingham collects school uniform donations all year round through our donation boxes in the schools we directly work with and public donations we receive at our shop.

All uniform donations are quality checked, cleaned and repaired whenever possible to ensure all the uniform items our service users receive are of high quality. All the uniform donations we cannot save are recycled for rags to ensure nothing is wasted.

Our shop is open to the public all year round by appointment only. We also host open days in the local area near the schools we work with during the summer holidays that allow parents/carers to come and pick through our uniform range.
