Supporting Reading at Home – Parent Meeting

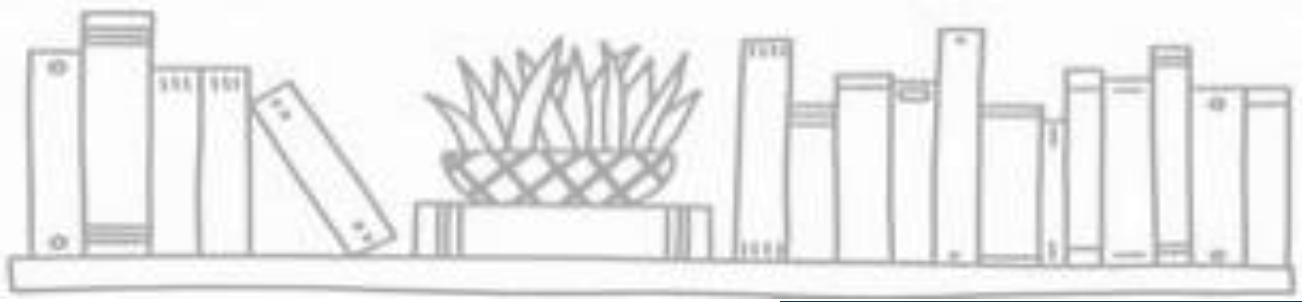
This half term, we will be hosting a parent meeting all about supporting reading at home. The session will include practical ideas and advice to help you support your child with their reading, whatever their age or ability.
